The Urban Ministry Institute and Mission India Theological Seminary have partnered together to provide TUMI Capstone Graduates an opportunity for graduate level education taught by some of the world's leading experts in engaging culture.

An Opportunity for TUMI's Capstone Graduates

TUMI Capstone graduates who have completed a bachelor's degree are eligible to apply for the Master of Arts Missiology of Movements program with these benefits:

- Apply 9 credit hours of the TUMI Capstone curriculum to reduce the MA degree to 51 total credit hours.
- Reduce the cost of your seminary education to \$4,500 for the Master of Arts degree.
- Prospective students must graduate from the TUMI Capstone curriculum with a 3.0 gpa.

TUMI Capstone graduates who do not hold a bachelor's degree yet have significant life and ministry experience may be eligible to apply for admission in the Master of Arts Missiology of Movements.

Eligible students will:

- Have successfully completed the Capstone Curriculum with a minimum 3.0 gpa.
- Be at least 30 years old.
- Have five years or more experience as a full-time pastor, cross-cultural worker, or church planter.

TUMI graduates in the majority world qualify for significant reduction of tuition through a generous scholarship. Scholarships are merit based.

Fuller Theological Seminary

A Ground-breaking Opportunity: Empowering TUMI Graduates

The Urban Ministry Institute (TUMI) and Fuller Theological Seminary have partnered together to provide yet another opportunity for TUMI Capstone Curriculum graduates (Certificate in Christian Leadership Studies).

Students who complete their TUMI Capstone Curriculum (Certificate in Christian Leadership Studies) can apply for Special Student Status for a masters program at Fuller Theological Seminary, if:

- The student has successfully completed TUMI, with a GPA of 3.0 or higher. An official transcript is required.
- The student must demonstrate at least 12 years of work experience subsequent to the completion of a high school diploma or GED.

- The student has at least 3 years of full time vocational ministry, or at least 5 years of significant (20 hours/wk or more) part time ministry.

A student can be admitted to Fuller without having earned an AA or BA degree.

The Berry Center for Lifelong Learning at Fuller Theological Seminary will give the student who has successfully completed the TUMI Capstone Curriculum (Certificate in Christian Leadership Studies) with a Certificate of Completion. A Ground-breaking Opportunity: Empowering TUMI Graduates

Lancaster Bible College has approved the ability for TUMI students to transfer completed TUMI modules for credit into Degree Completion. Each of the 16 modules from TUMI is worth 1.7 credits, for a potential total of 27.2 transfer credits. That's almost a year's worth of traditional college!

Lancaster Bible College

LBC is excited to also offer Continuing Education Units (CEUs) to TUMI students through Biblical Enrichment, our Non-Degree program. TUMI students can opt to earn CEUs through Lancaster Bible College for each TUMI course completed. Each TUMI course will earn 2 CEUs. A TUMI student would need to complete 15 courses (2 CEUs each) to earn an Advanced Continuing Education Certificate (30 CEUs), allowing them to participate in LBC's graduation ceremony and become official alumni of Lancaster Bible College. Our administrative fee for transcribing CEUs from studies elsewhere is currently \$10 per CEU. The cost to the student would be \$300 for CEU fees (currently \$10 per CEU) plus a graduation fee (currently \$50). Even while earning CEUs, and eventually LBC's Advanced Continuing Education Certificate, TUMI students will still have the option of transfer credits to LBC's Accelerated Undergraduate program. That is, TUMI courses may be used for both CEUs and transfer credits (not just one or the other). Designed for Flexibility

Biblical Studies (Modules 1, 5, 9, 13)
Theology and Ethics (Modules 2, 6, 10, 14)
Total of 8 courses = 13.6 credits in Bible and Theology

Christian Ministry (Modules 3, 7, 11, 15)
Urban Mission (Modules 4, 8, 12, 16)
Total of 8 courses = 13.6 credits in "Professional" (Church and Ministry Leadership department mostly). Can be used in Degree Completion towards "pure elective" credits.

LBC's A.S. degree = 61 credits. 27 credits in Bible and Theology. 22 in General Education (Arts & Sciences). And 12 pure elective credits. A student transferring in 16 modules from TUMI could finish LBC's A.S. degree through as few as 12 more courses. (They would need 13.4 more Bible/Theology credits, and 22 Arts & Sciences credits (a total of 35.4 credits = approx. 12 courses).

LBC's B.S. degree = 120 credits. 30 in Bible and Theology. 42 in General Education (Arts & Sciences). And 48 pure elective credits. A student transferring in 16 modules from TUMI could finish LBC's B.S. degree through as few as 21 more courses. (They would need 16.4 more Bible/Theology credits, 42 Arts & Sciences credits, and 4.4 more pure elective credits [48 minus 30 life experience credits minus 13.6 professional credits from TUMI] for a total of 62.8 credits = approx. 21 courses).

Students may also transfer in credits from other schools as well, which would further reduce their LBC credit requirements for graduation. Adults may complete these degrees entirely through online studies with LBC. There is no requirement to come to campus.

Pillar College

Based on The Urban Ministry Institute/Capstone Curriculum's current curriculum accreditation status, seat time requirements, and faculty qualifications, credits will be transferred as follows:

Pillar College offers a Biblical Studies Associate's and Bachelor's degrees in Biblical Studies, Business Management, Elementary Education, and Psychology and Counseling. Transferred credits would satisfy courses in the Bible Core, which all students receive as part of their degree requirements.

City Vision has a special partnership with TUMI to provide accredited Bachelor's in Business Administration, Addiction Counseling, Christian Ministry, or Nonprofit Management degrees for only \$5,000/year or \$500/course.

City Vision University is accredited by the Distance Education Accrediting Commission. Get Up to 32 College Credits Recognized from TUMI Training.

Qualifying students may also use Pell grants to pay their tuition.

Our 8-week online courses start 5 times a year and combine the benefits of on-site experience with the convenience of distance learning. We have students as young as 18, and some who are 60 or over, with an average age of 40. 79% of our students receive Pell grants.

Dallas Christian College (DCC)

Dallas Christian College (DCC) provides the opportunity to TUMI graduates to successfully transfer their TUMI credits into a degree program of their choice. DCC offers Associate Degrees in Business (A.A.S.) and Humanities (A.A.). DCC offers Bachelor Degrees in Practical Ministries (in Ministry Leadership, Youth & Family, or Intercultural Studies), Biblical Ministry, Worship Arts, Interdisciplinary Studies, Business Administration, Psychology, and Teacher Education. TUMI students can transfer completed TUMI modules for credit into any degree program, if the module grade is a "C" or higher. Transferring students can transfer in enough modules to cover up to 18 credit hours at DCC

DCC also provides a unique learning format for the non-traditional student. Through **FLEX**Campus® (www.dallas.edu/flexcampus), each class is only six weeks long, meeting one night per week. Students have the option each week to attend class:

ONCAMPUS – Join your peers on the DCC Campus

ONLINE – Interact live with the class remotely

ONDEMAND – Watch the recording of your class on your own time

How Students can Access the Program

To apply for admission to DCC, prospective students can go to: www.dallas.edu/apply to begin the application process. It is there you can find what else you will need to do for admission to the college.

For TUMI credits to be transferred into the college, the partnership between DCC and TUMI operates on a "make good" basis. If a TUMI grad comes to DCC and earns a good grade in Introduction to Biblical Research (or any of DCC's 2000-level or higher Bible or Theology classes), then DCC will accept and transfer in the following TUMI courses, assuming the student earned a "C" or higher in the TUMI courses:
